

Text Description of Safe Routes

Adult crossing guards will be on duty at 3 locations around Eastlake: Isla Daybreak Road directly in front of the main school entrance, directly west on Topview Road and Isla Daybreak Road, and at the intersection of Indigo Sky Way and Isla Daybreak Road. Sixth grade safety patrol and a teacher will assist students using crosswalk in the school parking lot before and after school only.

Students are to cross onto the school property using crosswalks and with the assistance of a crossing guard in front of the school where possible. All students should be respectful of crossing guards and safety patrol members. Please caution students to use sidewalks, walking paths and crosswalks.

Zone 1 North/West

Students walking from Northshore Village north of 10400 South, will walk along South Jordan Parkway to Topview Road where the crossing guard will walk them across South Jordan Parkway. At Topview Road they will head south on Topview Road and can head east on Mille Lacs Drive to Ozarks Drive to the crossing guard directly in front of the school; or they are able to continue south on Topview Drive to Isla Daybreak Road and cross with the crossing guard directly in front of Eastlake Elementary.

Students living in the Lake Village Peninsula will walk to Oquirrh Lake Road to Mille Lace Road and cross at the crosswalk. Students will then head south to Isla Daybreak Road and cross with the crossing guard directly in front of Eastlake Elementary.

Zone 2 South/East

Students walking from Jordan Heights subdivision east of 4000 West and Just north of Daybreak Parkway should walk along Hampton Way, Eureka Drive or Tippecanoe Way to 4000 West. Students should use the crosswalk and follow traffic light signals to 4000 West at Daybreak Parkway (11400 South). Students should continue to walk upward, following the walking trail west toward Topview Road. Students will walk along Topview Rroad until they reach Eastlake Elementary property.


Bused Students





South Jordan City has had a crossing guard at Enid Drive, crossing students east-to-west across Topview Road.
